Production

Regulation of Firearm Makers

In Croatia, the manufacture of small arms, ammunition and/or their components is permitted only if the maker holds a valid licence^{22 23}

Small Arms Manufacture - World Ranking

In a classification of the world's small, medium and major firearm manufacturers, Croatia is ranked 'small'²⁴

Transfers

Regulation of Firearm Exports

In Croatia, firearm and ammunition exports are limited by transfer control law [25](#) [26](#) [27](#) [28](#) [29](#) [30](#) [31](#) [32](#)

Small Arms Exports (US\$) - Customs

The annual value of small arms and ammunition exports from Croatia is reported to be US\$62,533,723³³ (2011)

Small Arms Exports - World Ranking

In a comparison of the world's major/mid-level/minor/unknown small arms exporters, Croatia is categorized as 'minor'³⁴

Regulation of Firearm Imports

In Croatia, firearm and ammunition imports are limited by transfer control law [25](#) [26](#) [27](#) [28](#) [31](#) [32](#)

Small Arms Imports (US\$) - Customs

The annual value of small arms and ammunition imports to Croatia is reported to be US\$4,129,930³³ (2011)

Smuggling Guns and Ammunition

Reports suggest that the level of firearm and ammunition smuggling in Croatia is high^{35 36 37 38 39 40}

Market Cost of an AK-47 Assault Rifle (US\$)

The asking price for an AK-47 pattern assault weapon in Croatia is reported to be US\$300⁴¹

Regulation of Arms Brokers

In Croatia, the activities of arms brokers and transfer intermediaries are specifically regulated by law^{42 43}

End User Certificates

Customs regulations in Croatia include^{44 45 42 26 46 47} certification of the intended end user of any small arms or ammunition transfer, and/or a written declaration of its intended end use

Transparency of Small Arms Transfers

In the most recent survey of state transparency when declaring firearm and ammunition exports, Croatia was ranked number 25 among 49 major small arms exporting nations in 2011, with a score of 10.50 points of a possible total of 25⁴⁸

Gun Regulation**Measures****Firearm Regulation - Guiding Policy**

The regulation of guns in Croatia is categorised as restrictive⁴⁹

Firearm Law

Guiding gun control legislation in Croatia includes the Weapons Law 1992 and the Law on Manufacturing⁵⁰, Overhaul, and Trade in Armaments and Military Equipment^{51 52}

Firearm Regulation Authority

Guns in Croatia are regulated by the Legislative Board of the House of Representatives⁵³, the Agency of the Government of the Republic of Croatia⁵⁴, the Police Department^{55 56}, the Ministry of the Interior,^{23 31} and the Ministry of the Economy, Labour and Entrepreneurship⁵⁷

Right to Possess Firearms

In Croatia, the right to private gun ownership is not guaranteed by law⁵⁸

Prohibited Firearms and Ammunition

In Croatia, civilians are not allowed to possess automatic weapons, semiautomatic arms and repeating long-barrelled firearms with a rifled barrel and magazine whose capacity is more than five rounds, long-barrelled firearms without a fixed grip, with a folding grip or with a grip shorter than 25cm, silencers, armour piercing and incendiary ammunition, or any other arms intended exclusively for military or police purposes⁵⁹

Regulation of Automatic Assault Weapons

In Croatia, private possession of fully automatic weapons is prohibited^{59 60 61}

Regulation of Semiautomatic Assault Weapons

In Croatia, private possession of semi-automatic assault weapons is permitted under licence^{62 61}

Regulation of Handguns

In Croatia, private possession of handguns (pistols and revolvers) is permitted under licence^{60 61}

Gun Owner Licensing

In Croatia, only licensed gun owners^{63 64 56} may lawfully acquire, possess or transfer a firearm or ammunition

Genuine Reason Required for Firearm Licence

Applicants for a gun owner's licence in Croatia are required to prove genuine reason to possess a firearm, for example, hunting, target shooting, collection, personal protection, security^{65 66 67 68 69}

Minimum Age for Firearm Possession

The minimum age for gun ownership in Croatia is 18 years⁶⁶

Gun Owner Background Checks

An applicant for a firearm licence in Croatia must pass background checks which consider criminal, physical health, domestic violence, and addiction^{66 70 71} records

Reference Required for Firearm Licence

In Croatia, third party character references for each gun licence applicant are not required⁵⁸

Domestic Violence and Firearms

Where a past history, or apprehended likelihood of family violence exists, the law in Croatia stipulates⁶⁶ that a gun licence should be denied or revoked

Firearm Safety Training

In Croatia, an understanding of firearm safety and the law, tested in a theoretical and/or practical training course is required^{66 68} for a firearm licence

Gun Owner Licensing Period

In Croatia gun owners must re-apply and re-qualify for their firearm licence every 10 years⁷²

Licensing Records

In Croatia, authorities maintain a record^{73 55 61} of individual civilians licensed to acquire, possess, sell or transfer a firearm or ammunition

Limit on Number of Guns

Licensed firearm owners in Croatia are permitted to possess any number of firearms⁵⁸

Limit on Quantity, Type of Ammunition

A licensed firearm owner in Croatia is permitted to possess any quantity of ammunition⁵⁸

Firearm Registration**Civilian Gun Registration**

In Croatia, the law requires^{60 61} that a record of the acquisition, possession and transfer of each privately held firearm be retained in an official register

Gun Dealer Record Keeping

In Croatia, licensed firearm dealers are required⁷³ to keep a record of each firearm or ammunition purchase, sale or transfer on behalf of a regulating

authority

Gun Manufacturer Record Keeping

In Croatia, licensed gun makers are required^{73 55} to keep a record of each firearm produced, for inspection by a regulating authority

Gun Sales and Transfers

Regulation of Dealer Gun Sales

In Croatia, dealing in firearms by way of business without a valid gun dealer's licence is unlawful⁷⁴

Regulation of Gun Shows

In Croatia, gun shows and temporary firearm dealing events are not required⁵⁸ in law

Storage and Transport of Guns and Ammunition

Firearm and Ammunition Storage Regulations - Private

Firearm regulations in Croatia include^{65 75} written specifications for the lawful safe storage of private firearms and ammunition by licensed gun owners

Firearm and Ammunition Storage Regulations - Dealer

Firearm regulations in Croatia do not include⁵⁸ written specifications for the lawful safe storage of firearms and ammunition by licensed arms dealers

Firearm and Ammunition Storage Regulations - Government

Government regulations in Croatia include⁷⁶ written specifications for the lawful safe storage of firearms and ammunition by state entities

Firearm and Ammunition Transport Regulations

Regulations in Croatia include^{77 78} written specifications for the lawful safe storage of firearms and ammunition while in transit

Marking and Tracing Guns and Ammunition

Firearm Marking

In Croatia, a unique identifying mark on each firearm is required by law^{79 80}

Firearm Tracing

In Croatia, state authorities carry out⁸¹ recognised arms tracing and tracking procedures

Ballistic Marking of Firearms and Ammunition

In Croatia, state authorities do not employ⁵⁸ ballistic fingerprinting technology to trace guns and ammunition

Carrying Guns

Carrying Guns Openly in Public

In Croatia, carrying a firearm in plain view in a public place is prohibited⁸²

Carrying Hidden Handguns in Public

In Croatia, carrying a concealed firearm in a public place is allowed with a permit and only if unloaded and holstered out of the view of the public⁸²

Penalty for Illicit Firearm Possession

In Croatia, the maximum penalty for illicit possession of firearms is up to 60 days prison and a fine up to 100,000 Croatian dinars⁸³

Collection, Amnesty and Destruction Programmes

Authorities in Croatia are known to have^{84 85 86 87 88} implemented voluntary firearm surrender schemes, and/or weapon seizure programmes in order to reduce the number of illicit firearms in circulation

Small Arms Destroyed

In Croatia, the total number of firearms destroyed following recent amnesty, collection and seizure programmes is reported to be

Destruction and Disposal Policy

In Croatia, it is not state policy^{89 90 91 84 87 92} to destroy surplus, collected and seized firearms rather than return them to the secondary arms market
